Some time ago, I attended a really interesting two day workshop on Embracing Stewardship: How to put stewardship at the HEART of your congregation's LIFE.

Charles Lane, a Lutheran pastor for forty-two years, offered his perspective on stewardship:

how a follower of Jesus Christ faithfully travels through this life. Contained in this one word are three important biblical teachings. First, God is the creator and owner of all that is. Second, God loves us so much that God has entrusted some of what God owns into each person's care. And third, how God's people manage what God entrusts into their care both flows from their relationship with God and impacts that relationship."

The word "stewardship" sometimes gets a bad rap because people often associate it with the church in the fall asking for money to support the church budget. Stewardship is so much more than that and its basis lies in the three premises listed above. And when we realize that what "I" have is God's, that it

The Arthur Mayer Fund

Although I never met the man, Arthur Mayer is a name that I have known since my first involvement in church finances. I have been told that he and his wife were regular attendees on Sunday, and he was always interested in the finances and growth of this Church. This may explain why in 1982 he made a gift to the church of \$25,000 with the stipulation

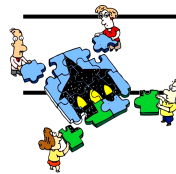
that it be used to purchase the property next door. Although this never occurred, the fund accumulated value, and when we renovated the Sanctuary some of the funds were borrowed during the renovation and then returned from other sources once the project was complete. This contributed greatly to the ability of the Trustees to have funds available when required and keep the renovation on schedule. At the time the total value of the fund had increased greatly. Since the restriction on the use of the fund was 20 years, and there was no longer a plan to purchase the property next to the Church, the Mayer Fund was then available for use by the Trustees as deemed appropriate.

This started in 2019 with \$5,000 being used to cover a General Fund shortfall, but the remainder of the funds have been used on capital improvements to Church properties including: the Church Kitchen \$15,200; removing the old air handlers in the East Wing basement \$22,840; purchase and installation of the new Church exterior doors \$5,100; regrading of the courtyard \$4,172, and other improvements which bring the total to nearly three times the original gift.

We should all be thankful that Arthur Mayer was a part of our congregation and will continue to be a part of our history. Perhaps we can all benefit from knowing what can happen to a gift of any size when cared for and allowed to grow over time.

Trustees Update



The Trustees continue to address our ongoing list of maintenance requests across our properties. Here are a few highlights. We’d like to remind everyone that if you see something about our buildings that needs attention please say something to one of the Trustees or fill out one of the Maintenance Request forms in the church mailroom. A friendly reminder to all to please not drag tables or heavy items in the Fellowship Hall as we work to make our newly finished floors last a good long time. We have had some ongoing challenges with our new exterior doors. We finally found the right profile threshold for the ramp door so it is no longer a tripping hazard. Also if you ever use the cord to hold the ramp door open be sure the cord is in the middle of the railing before attaching it to the door. If it is not we run the risk of over extending the arm and breaking the door, which has happened. We are now awaiting a replacement part. Our last request is to please keep the pair of corridor doors in the West Wing hallway closed at all times as required by our fire department.

The Solar Eclipse

April 8, 2024

Hi CUMC Church Community:



I was fortunate enough to be able to travel north to see the recent solar eclipse. Per my usual practice it was a last minute decision, so it was quite the adventure. In order to make it to the "Path of Totality" in cloud free conditions, navigation through high traffic areas was required. :-) We (I went with a few co-workers) ended up in a small town called Lunenburg in the Northeast Kingdom of Vermont. Yes, this is really the name of an area of Vermont - it borders Canada. People were gathered on the small town green for eclipse viewing. And yes, it was cloud free. :-)

When the moon covered the sun everyone on the small town green gasped ... clapped ... and there were many muffled screams. Rarely have I been part of something in which people could not contain themselves because of the sheer spectacle of the moment. I obviously cannot speak for others who witnessed it but it definitely seemed to be a moment which transcended day-to-day life for all who were there. That the moon could fully block the sun is still hard to imagine or comprehend. It made me contemplate all of the things far beyond my control and even my understanding — which had to happen for me to even be standing and observing that moment in that place on that day. What a lucky journey and what a privileged journey we all live in many ways. In addition, it seemed like God filled that place. I was very happy that there was a church on the town green (there actually seemed to be more than one church-like building on the green) and I thought of our church and our community. When the sun returned after the eclipse, it was like a 2nd summer day began as a special blessing for the community of people gathered there. Lucky for all of us this included the whole planet. :-)

For those wondering about more mundane matters - the duration of the total eclipse was a minute or maybe two minutes in that location. Drive time with traffic was 5 hours each way and to find food and eat took another 4 hours. So 14 hours of effort was required for 1 minute. But that minute was pretty spectacular. It was like the universe came to greet you for a minute, to let you see it up close.
