



## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Community UMC,

This year we are once again planning a Mardi Gras Pancake party to celebrate the final day before the season of Lent. Last year's plans were thwarted by bad weather predictions, but we have high hopes for a successful and fun time this year!



The season of Lent begins on March 5 with a 7PM Ash Wednesday service in which we are reminded of our mortality with the imposition of ashes on our foreheads, repent of our sins, and draw nearer to our loving and forgiving God. Lent then continues for 40 days (excluding Sundays) until we celebrate Easter on April 20.

Although the season of Lent is generally one of somber reflection prior to the full joy of Easter, I find it to be a very special time in which I can focus on my relationship with Jesus. It is nice to set aside some time for a particular spiritual practice that will help you to focus on Jesus and to think of Lent as a 40-day journey with him.

In previous years I have focused on journaling, fasting, walking, or reading a devotional book, as my spiritual practices. I may choose some of those again this year, but I also plan to read the Gospels of Mark and Luke, which have a combined total of 40 chapters. Perhaps you would also like to do this reading plan with me? Whatever you decide to do, I pray that you will feel God walking beside you on the Lenten journey.

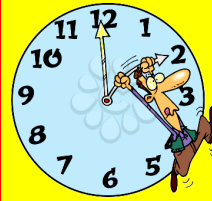

ing the week or even a couple of weeks afterwards on Facebook and on YouTube? Dave Shrewsbury is in charge of posting the services and he very graciously explained to me how all this works. I thought it would be beneficial to share the information with all of you.

Each week the technology people (usually the Tearles with help from others, on occasion) record the Sunday Worship Service. Then, after the service, they upload the recording to Dave Shrewsbury. Dave then adjusts any audio or video issues to optimize the recording so that it sounds as good as possible. His aim is to have this done so that he can post the recording on Facebook and on YouTube within a day or two. Dave tells me that we also provide automatic closed captioning on our videos that are posted to YouTube (not Facebook.) The captions are not always “perfect” because they are automatically generated by YouTube using speech recognition. However, this certainly does help our services to be more accessible to those with hearing difficulties. It may take another day or two for the captions to appear. To access a close captioned recording, all you have to do is hit the “CC” button. It is a blessing to have these different ways to be a part of the Worship Service each week and to hear the message, scripture, music, joys and concerns, etc. I know that you join me in thanking Dave and all those who work to bring our Worship Services to you whether in-person or on-line.

On March 5, we will begin Lent with a meaningful Ash Wednesday Worship Service at 7:00 PM. Please join us that evening as we begin the Lenten Season. On the 16th, the Sunday School Youth will share

eted or disbursements were lower. The summary below for 2024 shows this did not happen. This year, for the second year in a row, we ended with a deficit.

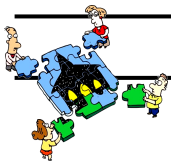
